1 2 3	SUBJECT: RESOLUTION #:	Maintaining FMLA Protections for First Responders on Short-Term Leave 23-11
4 5 6 7	WHEREAS:	IAFF Local 2781 represents first responders working at three shops, two of those employing fewer than 50 persons; and
8 9 10	WHEREAS:	First responders are called to do physically demanding work, where accommodations and light-duty are not always available; and
11 12 13 14	WHEREAS:	Paid Family Medical Leave (PFML) in the state of Washington is the most progressive paid leave law in the nation and has secured up to 12 weeks of paid leave for every employee in the state; and
15 16 17	WHEREAS:	Employees at agencies employing 50 or more persons receive all the protections of state and federal statutory family medical leave laws; and
18 19 20 21	WHEREAS:	Employees at agencies employing fewer than 50 are not guaranteed any of the job protections and benefit continuations required by the laws governing family and medical leave; and
22 23 24 25	WHEREAS:	RCW 50A.35.010 Employment Protection provides up to twelve work weeks of protected leave, including job protection and the continuation of health insurance at no cost to the employee, when the agency employs 50 or more people; and
26 27 28 29	WHEREAS:	First responders must meet far more strenuous fit-for-duty criteria than most workers and may require a longer duration of leave before returning to full, active duty; and
30 31 32 33 34 35	WHEREAS:	This disparity in treatment is unfair, unjust, and forces employees (most making less pay) to choose between spending thousands of dollars a month in COBRA payments or attempting to continue working while sick or injured; now therefore be it
36 37 38 39 40	RESOLVED:	That the WSCFF shall pursue, through legislation, an amendment to RCW 50A.35.010 or other applicable statutes providing commensurate job and benefit protections to ALL first responders, regardless of the size of the agency at which the employees work.
