4 5 6 7 8 9	WHEREAS:	Fire fighters across the nation are suffering from increasing rates of cancer as a result of their exposure to dangerous chemicals, toxins, and carcinogens from a variety of sources – including PFAS chemicals from department issued personal protective equipment and firefighting foams; and
10 11 12 13	WHEREAS:	The healthcare industry is developing new methodologies for testing and/or screening for cancers which hold the potential to detect and catch cancers earlier and earlier; and
14 15 16	WHEREAS:	Catching a cancer diagnosis in earlier stages leads to treatment earlier in the cancer progression; and
17 18 19	WHEREAS:	This leads to higher rates of patient survivability, better outcomes, and potentially quicker recovery with less impacting side effects; and
20 21 22 23	WHEREAS:	Treatments of various cancers – both those covered under current presumptive disease laws, and cancers that are not covered under presumptive disease laws – can pose a staggering financial cost for employers (and/or the State); and
24 25	WHEREAS:	Costs can easily run into the millions of dollars per case; and
26 27 28 29 30	WHEREAS:	In addition to potentially saving someone's life, screening for and diagnosing cancers in the earlier stages can significantly reduce treatment costs for a given cancer; now therefore be it
31 32 33 34 35 36	RESOLVED:	That the WSCFF pursue legislative options for state funded periodic cancer screenings for fire fighters working in the state of Washington and any retirees who are eligible for presumptive cancer coverage under RCW 51.32.185(2).
